Every case is dated, mapped, and carries published sources.

THE PATTERN

Across 23 years the sequence repeats: an American is killed or gravely harmed; the State Department calls for an investigation; Israeli authorities investigate themselves; no one is prosecuted. This holds for activists (Rachel Corrie, 2003), journalists (Shireen Abu Akleh, 2022), aid workers (Jacob Flickinger, 2024), elderly visitors (Omar Assad, 2022), and children and teenagers (Orwah Hammad, 14; Amer Rabee, 14; Mahmoud Shaalan, 16; Mohammad Khmour, 17; Tawfic Abdel Jabbar, 17).

MOST RECENT CASES

- **Sama Safi, 20** (Florida) — detained June 2, 2026, Ramallah, Occupied West Bank.
- **Nasrallah Abu Siyam, 19** (Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) — killed February 18, 2026, Mukhmas, Occupied West Bank.
- **David Adler, 33** (Encino, California) — detained October 1, 2025, International waters off Gaza (Global Sumud Flotilla).
- **Greg Stoker** (Austin, Texas) — detained October 1, 2025, International waters off Gaza (Global Sumud Flotilla).

WHAT CONGRESS CAN DO

- Demand independent U.S. investigations into the deaths of American citizens, and public reporting of their findings.
- Condition assistance on accountability where U.S. citizens are the victims, consistent with existing U.S. law.
- Require the State Department to report annually on cases of U.S. citizens harmed and the status of each investigation.
